

HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT FOREIGN LANGUAGE at CARIO

Students at Cario have the opportunity to take foreign language as a **YEAR-LONG** class in the 8th grade. Space is limited—and it is not **NECESSARY** to take foreign language in Grade 8.

- ☑ 7th Grade Intro Spanish is not required to be considered for a spot in 8th Grade Spanish.
- ☑ In order to be eligible for the lottery, you must have at least a 90 (end-of-year average) in your 7th Grade ELA class.
- ☑ Due to high demand, not all students who submit this form will make the class.
- ☑ All qualified students will be placed in a lottery for the limited spots.
- ☑ It is not possible to participate in Jazz Band AND Spanish here at Cario.
- ☑ How do you know you're in? When you see the class on your schedule!
- ☑ With successful completion of the course, students will earn one Carnegie Unit. **When choosing to take the credit, the course grade will become part of the student high school GPA.**
